Terms and Definitions

- *free verse*—poetry with no regular meter, rhyme, or line length; it depends on natural speech rhythms and varied line structures to develop ideas
- *stanza*—a unit of structure in poetry denoted by groups of lines that appear together, separated from other groups of lines
- *epitaph*—an inscription on a gravestone; a quotation or lines which summarize the life of the deceased; a burial inscription
- *anthology*—a collection of shorter literary works (poems, short stories, plays, essays) bound together in a single volume
- *extended metaphor*—a figure of speech in which one element is described in terms of a dissimilar element to highlight their differences for poetic effect and carried throughout the poem as a unifying element

parallel structure-phrases or lines of similar construction found at various points in a poem

rhetorical question—a question which does not seek or require an answer; the desired effect is achieved through asking the question.

autobiography-an account of a person's life related directly by that person.

- analogy---illustrating one idea through a more well-known idea, which has similarities to the first
- *alliteration*—repetition of beginning consonant sounds in successive or closely successive words in a line of poetry
- *allusion*—a figure of speech that makes a reference to a historical or literary figure, element, or object not in the work studied
- *first-person point of view*—a viewpoint in which the narrator relates personal experiences, using the first person singular pronoun.
- *cross-reference*—reference is made within one literary work to an element that appears in another literary work
